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Introduction

The methodological document accompanying the Interreg VI – A Italia-Malta Programme, in line with the provisions of the regulations of the 2021-2027 programming cycle, analytically illustrates the indicators selected for each Priority (axis) and Specific Objective of the Programme in relation to the financial resources allocated, the logical framework, the strategic choices, the objectives and the related actions.

It is a tool aimed at describing, the Performance Framework (Performance Framework) in line with the provisions of Articles 16 and 17 of Regulation (EU) 2021/1060 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 24 June 2021 laying down common provisions on the European Regional Development Fund, the European Social Fund Plus, the Cohesion Fund, the Just Transition Fund and the European Maritime, Fisheries and Aquaculture Fund and financial rules for those and for the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund, the Internal Security Fund and the Instrument for Financial Support for Border Management and Visa Policy.

The document consists of four sections:

1. the first relating to the strategy and logic of intervention of the Programme. This section refers to the logical framework of the Programme, to the links linking needs, actions and result and output indicators.
2. the second, dedicated to the system of indicators of the Programme and the approach chosen for their identification by Specific Objective;
3. the third, referring to the entire Programme, dedicated to the calculation method for the quantification of the values of the indicators and the methods of data collection
4. the fourth dedicated to the Programme's data quality assurance system.

1. The strategy and logic of intervention of the Programme

1.1 General framework of the Programme

The territorial analysis and the SWOT analysis of the cooperation area represent the starting point for the definition of the Programme strategy. The main results of the territorial analysis and SWOT provide, in fact, a broad picture of the socio-economic and environmental situation of the cross-border area, highlighting the main trends for the years to come and identifying the opportunities and needs.

The strategy of the Programme also takes into account the guidelines of the European Commission provided, in particular, through the following documents:

- *Cross Border Cooperation in the Mediterranean area* referred to in the note Ares(2019)7519308 – 06/12/2019 for the Italia-Malta cross-border cooperation area;
- the European Green Deal and the 2030 Climate and Energy Framework;
- Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2022/74 of 17 January 2022.

The 'lessons learned' from the 2014-2020 programming period are also a key element in defining the programme strategy, the intervention logic and the indicator framework.

The "key" concepts envisaged by EU legislation 2021-2027 are different from those of 2014-2020. These differences are the result of the lessons learned in the last period and the need to simplify and streamline programming, monitoring and evaluation.

The main changes related to performance, monitoring and evaluation are described in the European Commission Staff Working Document (SWD) 198 final of 08/07/2021 " *Performance, monitoring and evaluation of the European Regional Development Fund, the Cohesion Fund and the Just Transition Fund in 2021-2027*" and concern in summary:

- ✓ *Streamlining and reducing the number of policy objectives, specific objectives and the contents of the programmes involving a simplification of the intervention logic;*
- ✓ *A change in programming and monitoring from a focus on result indicators reflecting impacts to a focus on result indicators measuring outcomes (the change for direct beneficiaries)*
- ✓ *A more complete list of common output indicators and a new list of common result indicators with the intention to improve the investment coverage of common indicators for transparency, accountability, monitoring, evaluation and communication purposes at regional, national and EU level;*
- ✓ *A reformed performance framework will encompass all output and result indicators. It will be one of several factors taken into account in the mid-term review in deciding on the allocation of the flexibility amounts;;*
- ✓ *The use of specific objectives for the definition of the intervention logic, combined with aligned structured data on result indicators, output indicators and financial inputs (categorisation data) and more frequent data transmission;*
- ✓ *A simplification of certain evaluation requirements.*

The main challenges of the cooperation programme are geared towards:

- ✓ promote the growth and competitiveness of MSMEs in the area and foster technology transfer in areas of interest such as the green and blue economy, circular economy, health and quality of life, etc., but also cultural and creative industry, social enterprises, etc.;
- ✓ contribute to the broadening of the base of operators who are able to grasp and further develop the potential deriving from advanced technologies in areas of mutual interest such as the green

and blue economy, the circular economy, health and quality of life, etc. but also cultural and creative industry, social enterprises, etc.;

- ✓ mitigate the effects of climate change and anthropogenic impacts on the land-sea system and to improve the adaptability of human systems, institutions and other organisms in response to adverse events of a natural nature or resulting from human activities in such a way as to reduce negative alterations;
- ✓ reduce the negative impacts of waste and tourism on the environment by promoting the transition to a circular economy in which the value of products, materials and resources is preserved for as long as possible in the economy and the generation of waste and pollution is minimized;
- ✓ safeguard areas with high value or potential for biodiversity, ensuring forms of strict protection aimed at leaving the natural processes substantially intact to respect the ecological needs of the area, but still allowing the use by the population and the enhancement for tourist and economic purposes.
- ✓ enhance the theme of "usability for all" of cultural and natural heritage assets by experimenting with solutions that allow the regeneration of spaces and the revitalization of places of culture to promote initiatives in the cultural and creative field with the aim of inclusion and economic growth;
- ✓ the identification of the challenges, through the results of the territorial analysis, has helped to define the general objective of the Programme which is aimed at supporting the economic and social cohesion of the cross-border area, aiming at:
 - ✓ strengthen an innovative and sustainable economy;
 - ✓ protect, restore and enhance the environment and natural heritage;
 - ✓ mitigate the effects of climate change
 - ✓ improve the usability of cultural and natural heritage through forms of sustainable tourism.

The definition of the main objective of the programme determined the selection of the strategic and specific objectives of the Programme in relation to: the needs and cooperation needs of the programme area; the opportunity to potentially contribute to the European strategy on the basis of the guidelines provided by the European Commission; the outputs, results and actions carried out in the previous 2014/2020 programming cycle.

The strategic objectives and specific objectives selected are set out below:

To realize this vision, the Program can count on a total of financial resources equal to 57,604,031 euros, of which 80% as a contribution from the European Union and 20% as a national contribution.

1.2 Programme resources

The allocation of resources between the various priorities and specific objectives was carried out on the basis of a detailed analysis which took into account the following:

✓ the reconstruction of a first allocation hypothesis based on the distribution of the resources of the 14-20 cycle by single action linked to the specific objectives of 21-27. Specifically, a first distribution of the weights of the specific objectives was reconstructed on the basis of the weights of 14-20 as the first reference calibrated on the needs of the cooperation area;

✓ the thematic concentration constraints provided for in Article 15.1 of Regulation (EU) 2021/1059 which states "*Interreg A programmes along internal land borders shall allocate at least 60 % of the allocated ERDF contribution to policy objectives 2 and 4 and a maximum of two other policy objectives set out in Article 5(1) of Regulation (EU) 2021/1060*" and art. 15.2 of REG. 1059/2021 which reads "*Up to 20 % of the ERDF contribution and, where applicable, of the external financing instruments of the Union allocations to each Interreg A, B and D programme may be allocated to the Interreg-specific objective of 'a better cooperation governance' and up to 5 % may be allocated to the Interreg-specific objective of 'a safer and more secure Europe'*"

✓ the amount of the Funds allocated to the technical assistance provided for by art. 27.4 of Regulation (EU) 2021/1059 which reads: "*For Interreg programmes with a total ERDF allocation between EUR 30 000 000 and EUR 50 000 000 the amount resulting from the percentage for technical assistance shall be increased by an additional amount of EUR 500 000.*"

✓ some corrective measures to rebalance resources on the basis of the following elements: analysis of the needs and requirements expressed by the partnership during the consultation process carried out in line with Delegated Regulation (EU) no. 240/2014 on a European Code of Conduct on partnership within the European Structural and Investment Funds; capacity for absorption of resources detected in previous programming cycles.

All these elements, also applied at the level of the strategic objective, have made it possible to allocate resources in a weighted manner also among the specific objectives, as shown in Table 1.2.

2. The Indicators of the Italia-Malta Programme 21-27

2.1 The selection of indicators

This paragraph illustrates the output and result indicators selected for the Italia-Malta Programme 2021-2027.

The selection of indicators was carried out on the basis of the specific objectives selected and the types of actions identified in relation to the available financial resources. The indicators have been identified in such a way as to cover as many types of actions as possible, while keeping the indicator framework clear and simple.

A total of 10 indicators were selected:

- 7 output indicators: common indicators Interreg RCO01, RCO04, RCO81, RCO83, RCO84, RCO87, RCO116..
- 3 result indicators: common indicators Interreg RCR79, RCR84, RCR104.

For the selection of indicators in the programme, priority was given to the common indicators provided by the Commission. This choice was strongly recommended by the Commission for the purposes of transparency, accountability, monitoring, evaluation and communication at regional, national and EU level. In addition, the choice of common indicators makes it possible to aggregate data and demonstrate and communicate the results and impact of the programme even outside the territory of the programme.

As regards the Interreg-specific indicators, output and result indicators were selected, based on consistency with the intervention logic, the specific objectives selected and the relevance to the actions identified. The Interreg common indicators have been developed to measure and show the impact of territorial cooperation and have therefore been deemed appropriate to measure the results and impact of the Italia-Malta Programme 2021-2027.

Interreg output and result indicators were selected for all the specific objectives of the Programme as they proved to be relevant to the type of actions envisaged. In particular, the *result indicator RCR104 - Solutions taken up or up-scaled by organisations* reflects the objective of the Italia-Malta Programme to capitalize on project results in order to achieve and impact a larger portion of the Programme area.

The Interreg RCR79 result indicator referring to Strategies/Action Plans has been linked to the specific objectives of PO2, in line with the actions aimed at implementing interventions for the definition of common strategies and action plans under specific objective 2.3 (vii) of the Programme.

In relation to the *Result Indicator RCR84 - " Organisations cooperating across borders after project completion "*, the same it allows to measure the solidity and stability of the relationships undertaken during the implementation of the projects or within one year of their completion..

Although the majority of the selected output and result indicators have been replicated for the various specific objectives identified, they will be monitored in a timely manner by specific objective. This will provide a detailed picture of the Programme's concrete contribution to each of the topics addressed.

The selection of indicators in general and in relation to the specific policy and objectives was carried out with the aim of providing a harmonised perspective on the performance of the Programme and applying a simplified and transparent framework, while focusing on measuring and presenting the impact of territorial cooperation.

The indicators were selected in line with the RACER (Relevant, Accepted, Credible, Easy and Robust) criteria. That is, they are: relevant, that is, closely linked to the objectives to be achieved; accepted by Programme bodies, stakeholders and beneficiaries, credible to experts and non-experts and easy to measure; easy to monitor through the monitoring system. The selection of common indicators makes

it possible to use a harmonised methodology for data collection, without imposing additional burdens on the Managing Authority and beneficiaries; robust as the methodology for selection, calculation of objectives and data collection was developed in accordance with EC legislation and priority was given to common indicators in the selection of indicators.

At the same time, those indicators that were applicable to the majority of actions were selected in order to contain their number (while ensuring their representativeness) and therefore the administrative burden.

Finally, for the selection of both categories of indicators, the previous experience (2014-2020) and any critical issues that may have emerged were considered, where possible.

The output and result indicators are presented below through the intervention logic or by priority, specific objective, actions and category of intervention.

2.2 Indicators: programme choices by specific objective

The following paragraphs present the intervention logic of each Specific Objective selected, the related actions, the output and result indicators, the sectors of intervention and their relevance.

Specific Objective 1.1 - Developing and enhancing research and innovation capacities and the uptake of advanced technologies in the cross-border area

The strategy of the Programme aims to promote the growth and competitiveness of MSMEs in the area and to promote technology transfer in the areas of interest as described in the respective documents of the Smart Specialisation Strategy (RIS3) (such as the green and blue economy, the circular economy, health and quality of life, etc.), but also the cultural and creative industry, social enterprises, etc.) that ensures forms of development and sustainable growth.

The actions planned to be implemented in SO 1(Priority 1) with reference to specific objective 1.1 (Programme SO 1.1) are:

- ✓ Promotion of collaborative research (partnerships between companies and research centres)
- ✓ Provision of advisory and innovation support services

The intervention field financed through the programme, in line with the actions identified, is:

- 028 - Technology transfer and cooperation between enterprises, research centres and higher education sector

In order to achieve the change desired by the Programme under the specific objective, the following indicators have been selected:

Support interventions for SMEs are envisaged through the acquisition of specialized assistance and "quick impact" services (also in the form of vouchers) for the introduction of innovations and eco-innovations based on a technological approach (e.g. digital transformation, technology transfer, etc.), but also to promote non-tech business innovations (e.g. scouting to support innovative business ideas, (re)-organization of the company system, positioning on the markets and access to credit, etc.

4. Programme data quality assurance system

Programme structure indicators has been defined on the basis of their relevance, or so that they are representative of the most significant share of resources both in terms of size and content.

Common output and result indicators have been identified.

The main source is the local information system of the Program within which all the information necessary for the calculation of the result indicators and the measurement of the output indicators are available. In particular, if the current information system does not include some of this information, it will be collected from the beneficiaries themselves, guaranteeing adequate timing and detection techniques that comply with the data quality criteria and collection processes including accuracy and reliability, timeliness and punctuality, accessibility and clarity, comparability and ensuring the availability of resources and skills adequate for the purpose.

The output and result indicators will be valorised in the information system of the Program by the beneficiaries of the funded projects. The Lead partners of the funded projects will have to report on the physical progress of the operations periodically, based on the timing provided for by the manuals of the Programme, through the Reports on the financial, physical and procedural progress. Within the monitoring system, evidence of the achievements and results achieved must be made.

The monitoring system will allow the aggregation of data necessary for their communication to the European Commission twice a year in line with the provisions of art. 42 of Regulation (EU) 2021/1060 of 24 June 2021.

The valorization of the indicators will be carried out during the implementation of the projects and, at project completion., Programme bodies will ensure that projects report on the outputs and results obtained at each relevant stage of the project.

The key elements for data quality are:

- **Clarity of indicators:** The output and result indicators of the programme have been selected in a detailed and concrete manner to ensure a reliable and high-quality data system. The system of indicators will be made understandable to the beneficiaries of the operations financed. Ad hoc information meetings will also be organized on the occasion of the launch of the notices and during the implementation of the projects to monitor progress.
- **Definition of the role and responsibility** of beneficiaries in providing reliable data in compliance with the poor provisions of the programme and through progress reports and other tools deemed necessary.
